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#### **Mike Joffee Remembered**

I first met Mike at the June 1984 dinner meeting. Over the years we became very close friends. At that time Mike had been the Chair for the club's annual Memorial Day event, Sonnenfest. Mike was the chair for over 14 years, starting with events at Harder Hall in Sebring, Holiday Inn in Sebring, to Horacio Hornblower in Lehigh Acres. Mike was a stickler for detail, and all events went off without a hitch. All except one, the A/C for the meeting room stopped working, but mike was there, and we had A/C.

As you all know Mike was a concourse nut. He demanded perfection. He would, while judging, find dirt where you would least expect it. But during concourse prep he would walk by your car and give you hints of these hidden areas, that he would later be judging. He was not interested in seeing how many things he could find wrong with your car, but in helping you make your car more competitive.

Again Mike knew his cars. especially the 356 and early 911. He could just look at your car and tell you if the paint, interior vinyl, trim, engine, and trunk just to mention a few areas were correct. He would explain the problem, how to correct it, and where to find the materials to make the fix. Many times he would volunteers to help you make the fix.

About 15 years ago, together with Jerry Remillard, Jess Yarger and myself

we started going to the Porsche swap meet in Hershey, Pa. As time went by several other GC members joined the group. If you owned an old Porsche and need hard to find parts this is the place to go. In rummaging through the old parts boxes, sometimes a foot high, Mike could identify a part and tell what year and model Porsche it belonged to. Mike was also a whiz at restoration and restoring old parts. He once bought a rear seat set of seat belts for his 911S; they needed major work. When he finished you would think they just came

out of the box. He was also a whiz when it came to using paint spray cans. Rumor has it that he once painted a whole car using paint spray cans.

Mike was also great at auto-x. He always had top times. But what I remember most about his auto-x, is the video where he has the windows down and the sunroof open, loses control going through a turn, slides into a giant rain puddle, and, guess what!

In 89 we started going out to dinner on

I'm old but truly some great friendships.

When it all comes down to it I can get most of the benefits above from just showing up at any DE and driving as a student or solo driver. The real value of my involvement instructing comes when I have been working with a student to get the line, just right, through turns 3,4,& 5 at Sebring and he or she gets it. He has the car in exactly in the right place, settled and set for the series of corner. He steers smoothly through the corners, and is able to gets to full throttle by the apex of turn 5, the car sticks to the track like it's on rails just touching the rumble strip with the right tires exiting turn 5. For the first time today he is catching the car in front



and will be ready for a point by and pass before turn 7. It's all coming together. As we head down through turn 6, I look over at my student and ask, "How did that feel?" I can see his eyes light up and his cheek rising inside the full face helmet (as he smiles), and through the intercom he says YES!!!! Both hands on the wheel so there is no fist pump, but the words and the smile said, "Fist Pump!". The next lap it falls together again. When the session ends, we exit the car and peel off our helmets. Standing on either side of the car with wet hair and sweat soaked shirts he says, "Thanks so much, that series of corners has been a problem for me since my first day on this track". Above all else, that is why I instruct. Sharing my experience and joy of an activity I love with my student and being a part of their success. It is worth more than money to me.

If you are a solo driver I would encourage you to come out to our instructor school in November and take the next steps toward getting the benefit of that smile from your student. As a student I say stick with it and one day you will be there too, but in the mean time you will be gaining experience and knowledge making you a better driver and well, It's FUN. Wait, I think already said that. :-)

Annual Sponsorship Program Details

The Annual Sponsorship Program cost is \$2,500 and runs for a period of one year (12 Months) effective from the first day of the month following the date the agreement is signed. During that time the sponsor has the right to actively market his business at Gold Coast Region events, but does so under guidelines established by the club.

Annual Sponsors will receive the following benefits:

Only Annual Sponsors will have the right to hold Gold Coast Region, Technical, Social, Concours, Swap meets, or other gatherings at their place of business. (This does not include places of business that are destinations of organized Gold Coast events, such as Gunners, Auto dealers, Collier Museum, The Big Chill, Etc.) Only PCA, Gold Coast and, Annual Sponsors events, gatherings or functions will be listed on the calendar in the Kassette.

Annual Sponsor's name and logo will be printed on any Tee-Shirt provided to members or registrants at all events that shirts are part of the registration package.

All advertising, both print, internet, and social media will contain Annual Sponsor's name and logo.

All club banners and promotional materials will also contain Annual Sponsor's name and logo.

Event space will be given to the Annual Sponsor for company display. This space will be large enough for a  $10 \times 10$  tent if the venue allows, or a table and chairs if not. If the venue allows, display space for cars will be assigned to the Annual Sponsor.

Annual Sponsors can distribute flyers, beverages/snacks and business information, and do demonstrations from their display space.

Each month the club magazine (DIE PORSCHE KASSETTE) that is sent to all club members will have a Sponsor's section that will list each sponsor with contact information.

# TECH CORNER : FORCED TO FORCE IT

Whether the auto makers admit it or not, they have all been forced to force it!

Forced air induction (turbocharging and or supercharging) is now being (tacitly) forced on all automobile manufacturers, Porsche included.

There is no doubt that internal combustion engines have become much more efficient

year-after-year and decade-after-decade, burning much less fuel per miles travelled, producing more power and torque, and emitting less carbon dioxide, and **that's a good thing**.

It's the natural progression of things with technical development and sensible regulation and enforcement.

But under the PC "saving the environment" umbrella, governments are requiring car makers to burn <u>much less</u> fuel in their engines so they can meet the ever more stringent and sometimes arbitrary MPG requirements year after year. As we've said before, it's a game they play and have been playing for some time now and **that's not a good thing**. Let me explain ...

The only way to emit less carbon dioxide is to burn less fuel, period.

The stoichiometric point, the ideal ratio of air and gasoline in an internal combustion engine, requires 14.7 grams of air to completely burn 1 gram of gasoline. It's the job of your car's computer (DME) to measure the amount of air the engine inhales via the Mass Airflow Sensor (MAF) and then provide precisely the correct amount of fuel at the stoichiometric ratio of 14.7 - to - 1.

Car makers know that government fuel-economy tests, especially those outside the USA, approximate the driving style of a heavily sedated octogenarian great-grandmother. Since the engine is rarely taxed, the turbo doesn't spool up, so no extra fuel is used and the MPG numbers get to meet or best the environmental regulations. But purposely driving slowly enough to keep the turbo from generating boost defeats the point of having a turbocharger in the first place. Sadly, out in the real world, riding that big wave of boosted midrange torque means burning extra



fuel - and creating even more CO2. So much for reducing emissions.

Like I said, it's a game! So, the inevitable worst case scenario has happened for real Porsche lovers and enthusiasts.

Dr. Wolfgang Hatz, Porsche's head of R&D, has repeatedly stated in several interviews with television and car magazines that both, the Boxster and the Cayman for model year 2016 will have turbo-charged flat-4 engines instead of the normally aspirated flat-6 power plants they've had since their inception. Furthermore, Dr. Hatz has refused to comment if upscaled version of the two models would retain the naturally aspirated flat-6.

The last time Porsche offered a four-cylinder turbocharged engine in one of their sports car was over 20 years ago in the 1991 944 Turbo S and the 1994 968 Turbo S.



There have been many optimistic rumors about keeping both power plants, but the way we see it, offering several turbo flat-4s and several normally aspirated flat-6 engines on entry-level models isn't efficient enough in terms of costs, which is why the forced-fed flat-4 may eventually be offered as an exclusive engine option throughout the majority of the Porsche sports car line.



The new engines will feature turbochargers and direct injection, and will produce impressive power figures for their size. Horse-power reportedly ranges from 210 HP for a 1.6-liter, to 286 HP for a 2.0-liter, with the range topped-off by a 360 HP 2.5L engine. The 2.0L and 2.5L will produce 295 lb-ft and 347 lb-ft of torque, respectively. The 2016 Boxster and Cayman will be the first models to use the new 2.0L and 2.5L flat-4 engines.



These numbers look good, but I'm pretty bummed about the whole thing. In my book "there's no replacement for displacement".

A good friend of mine from Toronto likes to say that there's no better sound to listen to while driving your Porsche than the "**symphony in flat-6**" that your car performs and you get to be the conductor of the symphony! I wholeheartedly agree with him. It sure isn't going to be the same intoxicating music with a little flat-4 and its turbo waste gates popping off.

Instead of a symphony in flat-6 it'll be a high school marching band in flat-4!

Have you been to a Formulal race recently? My point exactly! This would be the perfect time to visit your Porsche dealer and snatch one the last 2015 Boxsters and/or Caymans which still sport the flat-6 engine. Maybe they'll start to appreciate in value, just like the 993 and all of the other "real Porsches"!

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The 48 Hours At Sebring Club race committee has begun making plans for the 2016 race to be held February 4 thru 7 2016.

It's time for all Gold Coast and Suncoast members to start planning how they can get involved. It is your opportunity to give back to your region and be involved with the most successful Club Race in PCA and help raise money for region activities and The Ronald McDonald House charity. Start making plans and reservations to make it a weekend of fun and excitement.

Where will you be? What will you be doing? What could you be doing that would possibly equal spending a weekend at world famous Sebring International Raceway with about 500 Porsches? Talk about a car show: this is the largest Porsche only racing event in the world – in fact, it is the largest single marque automobile racing event in the world! How could you miss it, especially when it is almost in your back yard!

Last year's 21st anniversary event was a great success: we had over 450 participating Porsches. #### What can you do to help?

<u>At Track Registration</u> We need 4 or 5 people to assist with getting the driver's checked in, this is an indoor siting job that begins at 7:00 AM Thursday, Friday and Saturday. The first couple of hours are the busiest so you need to be a morning person.

The Grid, we have a lot of people returning from last year to work the grid, but we still need a few more for each day. You need to be in good shape as it entails a lot of standing and walking. Your primary responsibilities are.

 Helping get each car in its assigned spot based on information on a timing sheet provided by Timing & Scoring.
 Doing a quick check of the car to make sure that it is not dripping any liquids, engine & trunk lids are closed and secured, etc.

3.Checking the driver to ensure that he or she is buckled in, with helmet on and secured.

**Timing and Scoring**, we need about 5 volunteers each day. You will assist the stewards in identifying the cars as they go past the start/finish line to verify that their timing equipment is working properly. You will also assist in the preparation of the timing sheets for distribution to the grid. This is a nice comfortable inside job but it is the heart beat of the race.

Tech and Scales, we need a volunteers

each day to help check the Advanced Solo group cars for tire pressure, Torque lug nuts and check helmets, brake lights. Thursday and Friday are the busiest days for tech. Scales are open Friday through Sunday. The race cars are weighed on the scales to make sure they are the proper weight for their car and class. Volunteers are needed to push the cars on the scales.

The Corners, we need volunteers to assist the SCCA corner-workers at each corner. This is truly where the action is! Working the corners is a fun and action packed assignment. Each corner throughout the track is manned by 1-2 professional SCCA corner workers. For each corner, we assign a maximum of 2 volunteers to assist the SCCA corner workers. We have many volunteers who return each year and request a specific corner or corner worker. It's amazing how much you can learn while watching skilled drivers go through a corner lap after lap. There is no better way to get closer to the action unless you are actually driving!!

The responsibilities for the corner are: 1.You are an extra set of eyes and ears for the SCCA corner worker, helping observe the activities on the track;

2.In the event of an incident the corner worker may ask you to hold or wave the appropriate flag.

3. You may be asked to assist with any reporting of an on track incident. Notes.

At no time would you go over the wall! Long pants and closed-toe shoes are required.

Please do not wear colors that would be confused as a flag, for

example red or yellow. White or the 48 Hour t-shirt are perfect.

<u>Pit Marshalls</u>, This is a Sunday-only job which starts around 10:00 AM with a meeting with the race steward.

This position is needed during the Enduro. Each driver is required to make a 5 minute pit stop during the each Enduro.

We need at least 12 people to observe the pit stops.

The responsibilities for Pit marshals are, 1.Observe and report to PCA scrutinizer any spilled fuel etc.

2.Observe and report any crew member over the wall without proper equipment3.Make sure that the maximum number of crew over the wall is not exceeded.4.Enforce all rules as instructed by PCA

Scrutineers. Notes.

Long pants and closed-toe shoes are required.

Training will be provided by PCA officials.

**Traffic Control** This position is needed to control traffic to allow the racers easy access to the grid before each run and back to their assigned area after the run.

Miscellaneous Positions.

We need other volunteers to help with the Friday and Saturday night activities This is where we raise the most money for the charities. We need a few other volunteers to take on whatever task that may come up.
